A MILITARY PARADE

I had a unique opportunity this August. A friend with a jeep, a 1943 GPW, asked if I would co-drive on the 100th anniversary of the first official military vehicle crossing of the United States on the Lincoln Highway. One hundred years ago the Lincoln Highway in many places was not much more than a dirt track through mud and sand. There are videos in the national archives of the arduous effort much of this first crossing required. In 1919 the U.S Army Convoy of seventy two vehicles, and two hundred and ninety seven men consisted of motorcycles, ambulances, an officers work truck, search light and tank trucks, a mobile kitchen, an engineering shop, and civilian vehicles from three tire manufacturers, several automobile companies, reporters and individuals from the "good roads" boosters.

The convoy left the White House on July 8th, 1919 and headed for San Francisco. In Iowa, they entered Clinton, traveled on what is now Highway 30 through Cedar Rapids, Monrovia, Marshalltown, Ames, Jefferson, Carroll, Denison, Missouri Valley, and Council Bluffs. Iowa was noted in 1919 as having a better collection of concrete roads and bridges than other states along the way. Notably the Lincoln Highway bridge in Tama is one of the few original bridges still in use today. Over one hundred other bridges along the way were damaged and repaired during the crossing. President Dwight "Ike" Eisenhower (1890-1969) was a Lieutenant Colonel on the convoy in 1919. After WWII and during his presidency President Eisenhower signed the Federal Aid Highway Act which created the interstate highway system which we continuously use today.

On the 2019 Lincoln Highway Memorial Convoy there were approximately seventy vehicles. This number changes as individuals join and drop out of the convoy as schedules allow. Dave, his jeep, his father, (driving the more comfortable Ford Expedition with trailer) and I joined in Chicago and exited in Marshalltown.

Along the route all the small towns and along the highway there were scores of people waving, saluting, taking video, and welcoming us at every stop with snacks, food, good conversation and history. As a co-driver in the jeep, it was quite emotional to see the national pride and support the convoy received.

In driving a seventy three year old vehicle, there can be issues. We spent many weekends preparing the jeep for the trip. New tires, brake work, fresh fluids, wiring, rigging a temporary top in case of rain, adding fuel cans, greasing every zirk and adjusting to factory specifications. Did this prevent any issues? No not guite. The jeep started and ran well despite having a very binary clutch. When it didn't run well, we were at the tail end of the convoy, just one vehicle in front of the "Recovery Team" when crawling through town in parade formation a mere couple of block from the fair grounds to camp for the night, the right rear axle broke of a stress fracture without making a sound. A strap was tossed to the lead recovery vehicle and the final blocks were accomplished under tow. The broken axle was quickly identified, as the axle can be unbolted at the rear hub and slid out of the differential tube. We walked to the campsite of one of the recovery crew and showed him the shattered axle. He got up from his chair, reached over the side of his support pickup truck and extracted without fanfare a New Old Stock axle, complete with the script F indicating it was a Ford manufactured original. We were all impressed that in less than ten minutes from a significant breakdown, we had a new part in hand. The differential was opened and the pumpkin removed. The broken bits and pieces were extracted. Everything was cleaned out, buttoned up and we were ready for the next day just as the sun left the sky.

The weather could not have been better during trip. It afforded large crowds at every stop, including our final stop at the veteran's home in Marshalltown. The children were allowed to climb on most vehicles, and plenty of conversations were enjoyed. The caravan was organized by the Military Vehicle Preservation Association, a group of over 7000 international enthusiasts, historians preservationists and collectors interested in the acquisition, restoration, preservation, safe operation and public education of historic military transport. And international it is. On this trip we met a large group of drivers from New Zealand, one from Belgium, and others from all over the United States.
